There are many residential homes that were damaged and destroyed in the storm and they are being rebuilt and updated. This new construction and remodeling is all looking good for the town recovery, it is helping with the mental toll the Tornado had caused in our lives and the future is looking very exciting for the Minden residence and the entire area.

Thank you Stacie and WIDA for Keeping Minden in your thoughts and prayers and also in front of your followers. We are Minden Strong community and are moving forward in our recovery every day.

Starting our business in district, there has been a lot of work and rebuilding being completed on several local businesses and we are excited to have them building back. There are several businesses that have been able to stav open or have reopened in the last year since the Tornado and there are 4-5 that will be opening up in the next month or so including some new businesses.

With a couple of grants and teaming up with Habitat of humanity of Council Bluffs we have been able to purchase 7 lots together residential area of town to put in 3 new duplexes units. We also have a local investor installing 3- new 4 plex Town House Style homes on some empty lots in town. These 2 projects will be a welcome addition to our town and our shortage of housing in the area.

As the City of Minden's Mayor and our council are working moving forward with plans to rebuild our city buildings, parks, down town lighting, infrastructure, streets, curbs, sewer lift station and water plant facility. We have been working on lots of funding programs, Grants, FEMA, Iowa West, Lakin Foundation, Pottawattamie County, Iowa Insurance, State, USDA, Habitat for humanity and many other organizations that is available to help. We are also trying to help with the Minden community Club, with there future plans for a new community building, ball parks and etc.. We are also looking at the future for our north 40 acre housing development,. Bike and walking trails, dog parks, Pickle ball courts and any other program we are interested in giving to our community.

As you can see there are lots of balls being thrown in the air right know and we are trying to catch them as they come in to our hands.

STRENGTH & RESILIENCE REBUILDING MINDEN

As we all know, on April 26, 2024, Minden faced a devastating EF3 tornado that caused significant destruction. The tornado, part of a larger outbreak across the Midwest, damaged 180 homes in Minden, with 40% destroyed, and obliterated 90% of the business district. Tragically, one resident lost their life, and several others were injured.

In the aftermath, the community rallied together to begin the recovery process. A FEMA Disaster Recovery Center was established in Minden to assist residents with aid and resources. Additionally, the Minden lowa Community Fund was created to support cleanup and rebuilding efforts.

Despite challenges with insurance claims delaying some recovery efforts, the town has made significant strides in rebuilding. In February 2025, the lowa Economic Development Authority granted \$1.2 million to Minden for affordable housing projects, marking a significant step forward in the town's recovery.

As Minden continues to recover, the town's experience serves the strength and testament to determination of its residents. The rebuilding process has not only focused on restoring physical structures but also on reinforcing the sense of community that defines Minden.

With ongoing support from local and state agencies, as well as the unwavering commitment of its citizens, Minden is poised to emerge from this tragedy stronger and more united than ever.





He had also worked at the locker as the slaughter guy and butchered on the table.

Fast forward 6 years, we have grown so much together! I bought the catering from Jeff in 2024. Cole is now an industrial service technician at Rasmussen Mechanical. We have 4 beautiful children, Charlotte (9), Harper (9), Dakota (2), and Isabella (1). We love going on adventures and family vacations. Our older daughters also love riding their horses and barrel racing.

The tornado that hit Minden in 2024 was absolutely devastating. Three of our family members' homes were a complete loss. Luckily the catering building had very minimal damage. The roof was stripped off and the catering vehicles were destroyed.

People were without power for many days. The town was at a standstill trying to clear paths, so volunteers could come help. My youngest daughter was 2 weeks old, and I had a c-section so my mobility of carrying heavy items was limited. The best thing I could think of to help everyone was to offer free lunches and dinners. We brought our generator from home and were able to cook food in roasters. I had a couple tables set up in the kitchen for people to come sit and take a break. It wasn't the best, as it was lit up by flashlights! But the community was able to come and chat with each other. The presence of my newborn baby definitely helped put smiles on faces!

It has been a journey for sure, but here we are a year later. Staying strong and rebuilding our town!
